A sermon depends on the power of the Spirit

A sermon arrives with the power of the Spirit

- 1. The conviction of the Spirit.
- 2. The illumination of the Spirit.
- 3. The witness of the Spirit.

And so...

- 1. The sermon is a divine act.
- 2. A recorded sermon is not a sermon.
- 3. Powerpoint, fit for teaching, does not fit for preaching.

3 Likewise, wives, **be subject** to your own **husbands**,

so that even if some do not obey the word, they may be won without a word by the conduct of their wives, 2 when they see your respectful and pure conduct.

3 Do not let your **adorning** be external—the braiding of hair and the putting on of gold jewelry, or the clothing you wear—

4 but let your **adorning** be the hidden person of the heart with the imperishable beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which in God's sight is very precious.

5 For this is how the holy women who hoped in God used to **adorn** themselves, by **submitting** to their own husbands, 6 as Sarah obeyed Abraham, calling him lord. And you are her children, if you do good and do not fear anything that is frightening.

This passage is about wives conducting themselves for the glory of God when their husbands are disobedient to God.

Because Jesus is your faithful husband, you do not need to fear being subject to your human husband.

- I. Wives, be subject to you own husbands. Win him with your beautiful conduct.
 - I. So that even if they do not obey.
 - II. So that they may be won because you do.
 - 1. Adoring yourselves with a beautiful heart. Win him with your beautiful heart.
